Legislative Update

A couple highlights of bills championed or introduced by Councilmember McDuffie recently at the D.C. Council:

- Helping a Ward 5 small Business The Food, Environmental, and Economic Development in the District of Columbia Amendment Act of 2016 expands a previous law that gives tax incentives for up to 10 years for qualifying supermarkets opening up in food deserts. Good Food Market on Rhode Island Ave fits this description perfectly, except that it was not in one of the designated census tracts delineated in the legislation. This amendment expands the previous law so that Good Food Market can enjoy these benefits as well. This bill has passed first vote of the Council and awaits a second vote.
- Banning Powdered Alcohol You may have heard of a new product called 'powdered alcohol.' This is just what it sounds like: a powder that can be mixed with a liquid and the result is an alcoholic beverage. As of November, 27 states have moved to ban powdered alcohol and the Omnibus Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Amendment Act of 2016 would

- do that for the District of Columbia as well. This bill has passed first vote of the Council and awaits a second vote.
- Requiring that Developers Engage the Community The Land Disposition Transparency Act passed first vote of the Council last week. This bill does a couple different things, including incorporating a provision Councilmember McDuffie introduced last year as a stand-alone bill. In the past, developers could locate part of one development in one part of town and locate the affordable housing units in another part of town, without even holding a community meeting in both locations! Councilmember McDuffie's contribution to this legislation ensures that developers who are building in more one area than must engage with the communities they would like to build in. Before they are granted the right to do so. This bill has passed first vote of the Council and awaits a second vote.

<u>DC Health Link's</u> open enrollment season began on November 1st. Residents have until January 31, 2017 to enroll in quality affordable health insurance for themselves and their families. If they enroll by December 15, 2016, coverage can begin January 1, 2017. Residents can apply for Medicaid throughout the year. There is FREE expert enrollment support and as well as financial help with monthly premium.

Please note the outcome of the 2016 presidential election doesn't impact your ability to enroll residents in health insurance for 2017. DC Health Link has 20 private health insurance options to choose from for residents and their families from CareFirst and Kaiser Permanente. Small businesses have 151 health plan options from Aetna, CareFirst, Kaiser and United. Small businesses can sign up throughout the year.
